artistic residency has become widely adopted in western countries while only recently having become popular and well supported within taiwan this book explores the challenges that this form of art practice faced in contemporary taiwan from the revocation of martial law in 1987 to the 2000s arguably one of the most exciting periods in the sociocultural history of the island case studies show what is at stake politically historically and socially in artists endeavours to give shape to a sense of taiwanese identity despite the prevalence of artists engaged in social issues in today s world and the undeniable contributions of artistic residency to contemporary art practice little literature or scholarly research has been conducted on the practical conceptual and ideological aspects of artist residency very often it is perceived in very narrow terms overlooking explicit or hidden issues of localism nationalism and globalization if artistic residence did indeed emerge from the radical movements of the 1960s and 70s in the western world and especially britain then this book argues that the contemporary sociocultural context of taiwan calls for redefined culturally specific models of residency the precarious geo political situation of taiwan has made issues of cultural identity tackled by artists and successive governments alike very sensitive a new genre of artistic residence in taiwan would mean that artists involved from whatever cultural background operate as engaging interpreters their roles would not be confined to mirroring culture and society these artists in residence would contribute to cultural awakening by offering ways of negotiating creatively with otherness and this for the sake of a better social life and shared identity

this admirable and necessary volume allows the original writers to speak to us directly though all this is carefully documented we are at the same time spared any layers of scholarly interpretation rather the richness of the original reaches us complete donald richie japan times may 14 2006 japanese artists musicians actors and authors have written much over the centuries about the creation meaning and appreciation of various arts most of these works however are scattered among countless hard to find sources or make only a fleeting appearance in books devoted to other subjects compiled in this volume is a wealth of original material on japanese arts and culture from the prehistoric era to the meiji restoration 1867 these carefully selected sources including many translated here for the first time are placed in their historical

context and outfitted with brief commentaries allowing the reader to make connections to larger concepts and values found in Japanese culture the book is a treasure trove of material on the visual and literary arts but it contains as well primary texts on topics not easily classified in Western categories such as the martial and culinary arts the art of tea and flower arranging more than 60 color and black and white illustrations enrich the collection and provide further insights into Japanese artistic and cultural values

district of west bengal starting from north bengal to south bengal west bengal boasts a rich literary and cultural heritage with evidenced by authors like rabindranath tagore folk music like baul gambhira as well as najrul geeti rabindra sangeet west bengal is the home of a thriving cinema industry dubbed tollywood throughout the year many festivals are celebrated in bengal highlights of the book literature the bengali language boasts a rich literary heritage shared with neighbouring bangladesh west bengal has a long tradition in folk literature evidenced by the charyapada mangalkavya shreekrishna kirtana thakurmarjhuli and stories related to gopal bhar in the nineteenth and twentieth century bengali literature was modernized in the works of authors such as bankim chandra Chattopadhyay michael madhusudan dutt rabindranath tagore kazi nazrul islam sharat chandra Chattopadhyay jibananda das and manik bandyopadhyay in modern times jibanananda das bibhutibhushan bandopadhyay tarashankar bandopadhyay manik bandopadhyay ashapura devi shirshendu mukhopadhyay buddhadeb guha mahashweta devi samresh majumdar sanjeev Chattopadhyay and sunil gangopadhyay among others are well known music and dance the baul tradition is a unique heritage of bengali folk music which has also been influenced by regional music traditions other folk music forms include gombhira and bhawaiya folk music in west bengal is often accompanied by the ektara a one stringed instrument west bengal also has an heritage in north indian classical music rabindrasangeet songs composed and set into tune by rabindranath tagore and nazrul geeti by kazi nazrul islam are popular also prominent are other musical forms like dwijendralal atulprasad and rajanikanta s songs and adhunik or modern music from films and other composers from the early 1990s there has been an emergence and popularisation of new genres of music including fusions of baul and jazz by several bangla bands as well as the emergence of what has been called jeebonmukhi gaan a modern genre based on realism bengali dance forms draw from folk traditions especially those of the tribal groups as well as the broader indian dance traditions chau dance of purulia is a rare form of mask dance state is known for bengali folk music such as baul and kirtans and gajan and modern songs including bengali adhunik songs films the state is home to a thriving cinema industry dubbed tollywood tollygunj in kolkata is the location of numerous bengali movie studios and the name tollywood similar to hollywood and bollywood is derived from that name the bengali film industry is well known for all kind of films and has produced acclaimed directors like satyajit ray mrinal sen tapan sinha and Ritwik Ghatak prominent contemporary directors include Buddhadev Dasgupta Goutam Ghose Aparna Sen and Rituparno Ghosh it has also produced famous film personalities like Uttam Kumar Soumitra Chatterjee Suchitra Sen Kanon Devi Kishore Kumar and many more fine arts bengal had been the harbinger of modernism in fine arts abanindranath tagore called the father of modern indian art had started the bengal school of art which

was to create styles of art outside the european realist tradition which was taught in art colleges under the colonial administration of the british government the movement had many adherents like gaganendranath tagore ramkinkarbaij jamini roy and rabindranath tagore after indian independence important groups like the calcutta group and the society of contemporary artists were formed in bengal which dominated the art scene in india reformist heritage the capital kolkata was the workplace of several social reformers like raja ram mohan ray iswar chandra vidyasagar and swami vivekananda these social reforms have eventually led to a cultural atmosphere where practices like sati dowry and caste based discrimination or untouchability the evils that crept into the hindu society were abolished costumes bengali women commonly wear the shari often distinctly designed according to local cultural customs in urban areas many women and men wear western attire among men western dressing has greater acceptance men also wear traditional costumes such as the panjabi with dhuti often on cultural occasions festivals durga puja in october is the most popular festival in the west bengal poila baishakh the bengali new year rathayatra dolyatra or basanta utsab nobanno poush parbon festival of poush kali puja saraswatipuja laxmipuja christmas eid ul fitr eid ul adha and muharram are other major festivals

offering a negative definition of art in relation to the concept of culture this book establishes the concept of art culture to describe the unity of these two fields around named labour idealised creative subjectivity and surplus signification contending a conceptual and social reality of a combined art culture this book demonstrates that the failure to appreciate the dynamic totality of art and culture by its purported negators is due to almost all existing critiques of art and culture being defences of a true art or culture against inauthentic manifestations and art thus ultimately restricting creativity to the service of the bourgeois commodity regime while the evidence that art culture enables commodification has long been available the deduction that art culture itself is fundamentally of the world of commodification has failed to gain traction by applying a nuanced analysis of both commodification and the larger systems of ideological power the book considers how the surplus of art culture is used to legitimate the bourgeois status quo rather than unravel it it also examines possibilities for a post art culture world based on both existing practices that challenge art culture identity as well as speculations on the integration of play and aesthetics into general social life an out and out negation of art and culture this book offers a unique contribution to the cultural critique landscape
